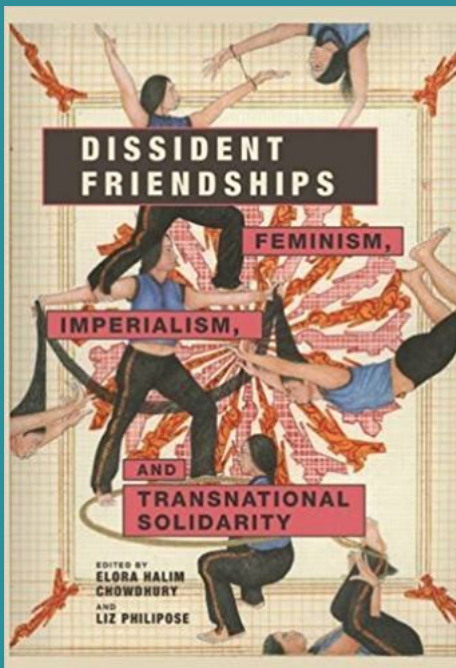


# Dissident Friendships: Feminism, Imperialism, and Transnational Solidarity
